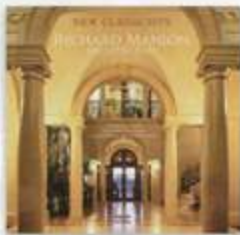

One of L.A.'s most important antiques and vintage dealers, JF Chen, is publishing his own tome dedicated to all things Eames. In *Collecting Eames: The JF Chen Collection* (\$65), he displays more than 300 pieces—storage units, tables, chairs and even toys—produced by Ray and Charles Eames from 1939 to 1998.



Villa-Fied

L.A.-based architect Richard Manion is one of the city's most respected designers of mega-mansions that honor both classical elegance and square-footage fantasies. His first book, *New Classicists: Richard Manion Architecture* (\$90, Images), chronicles the range of his work found everywhere from Malibu and Beverly Hills to New York and Shanghai.



Roughing It

Forget that perfectly polished sheen. *Rough Luxe Design* (\$125, Farameli Media) is a celebration of all things worn, washed, patina'd and aged. Interior designer Kahi Lee has curated the book's collection of commercial and residential projects that have elevated the look of raw imperfection to an art form.

• Moving Parts

Almudi Yard, the beloved, off-Melrose collection of insider home shops, has experienced some major changes. **Harbinger** (752 N. La Cienega Blvd., West Hollywood, 310.858.6884, harbingertla.com), the 1,000-square-foot gem of a shop, has relocated to a space four times its size on La Cienega. **Nathan Turner** (8546 Melrose Ave., West Hollywood, 310.275.1209, nathanturner.com) has decamped to

much bigger retail digs on Melrose Avenue, while **Kathryn Ireland** (636 N. Almont Drive, West Hollywood, 310.246.1906, kathrynireland.com) has moved from Almont's tiny, upstairs perch to the much larger front building, previously occupied by Nathan Turner. (Got that?) Meanwhile, **West Elm** (8366 Beverly Blvd., L.A., 323.782.9672, westelm.com) is opening a mega-showroom (as in 34,000 square feet of retail space) on Beverly Boulevard in the former Blueprint location.
